* In the illustration above, two fabrics were used for Fabric 3.8843 Celebration White/Red was used for the red Pinwheels and 8842 Celebration White/Blue for the blue Pinwheel blocks.



## DIRECTIONS

1- Mark the wrong side of A with a $4 \times 6$ grid of $3-7 / 8$ " squares. Mark each square once diagonally.

2- Place the A and H pieces right sides together. Sew $1 / 4$ " away from both sides of each diagonal line, as shown in diagram. Be careful not to sew over the points of each triangle.



3- Cut the HST (half square triangle) pieces apart along all the marked lines. Press. Trim excess as needed.

4- Using the same technique, repeat steps 1 through 3 for fabrics marked B and I.

5- Sew the A-H blocks and the B-I blocks together as shown. Make 48 total, enough for both the red and the blue pinwheel blocks.

## For each red block:



6- Sew K to G.
7- Sew the K-G triangles to the L square.

8- Sew the HST blocks to the sides as shown in diagram.

9- Sew D blocks to the ends of two more of the HST
 blocks to make the top and bottom rows. Sew the top and bottom rows to the middle section as shown. Make six.

10- Repeat steps 6-9
to make each of the blue blocks. Make six.


11- Sew the E sashing pieces to the blocks as shown below, creating four horizontal rows of three blocks each.


NOTE: Please read the entire pattern carefully. Every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy of this pattern. Use a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance unless otherwise stated. 12- Sew the remaining E sashing pieces and the J squares together, making five horizontal rows. and continue to assemble the quilt as shown below.


13- Sew the N borders to the sides of the quilt,
14- Sew the $F$ squares to the $M$ borders, then sew to the top and bottom of the quilt.


15- Sew the C squares to the ends of the top and bottom border strips.
16- Sew the side borders to the quilt
17- Sew the top and bottom borders to the quilt.
18- Layer the backing, batting and top, wrong sides together and quilt as desired. Baste.
19 - Bind using a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance.
