Preparing for a career in textile related professions. Plan to enroll in a Home Making Apparel Course of study, i.e Textile Production. The Apparel Course of Study includes fashion, designing, pattern making, study of materials, dyes and all Things related to textiles. This scholarship is open to both female and male Applicants having the highest grade point average.

CONSIDERATION FOR THE AWARD SHALL BE RESTRICTED TO PERSONS SELECTED BY SCHOOL OFFICIAL RECOMMENDATIONS WHO CONSIDER ACDEMIC PERFORMANCE AND ACTIVE PARTICIPATION IN OTHER ACTIVITIES.
