February we welcome **Weeks Ringle**. You have heard from our last two speakers how much they think of Weeks.

Weeks and her husband, Bill Kerr opened the Modern Quilt Studio in 1999, but don't let the modern scare you. They are professional quiltmakers, pattern designers, magazine publishers, book writers, fabric designers for Benartex Fabrics, and excellent teachers. On Thursday, February 7, Weeks will conduct a workshop entitled "The Role of Color in Your Quilts" from 9:00 - 12:00 and conduct a Fabric Smackdown from 1:00 - 4:00 where you'll learn to analyze and understand fabrics then apply what you've learned to create palettes for future projects. On Friday, February 8, Weeks will teach the class Improvisational Piecing which is a highly rated class of hers. When you attend her lecture on Saturday, February 9, if you didn't sign up for one of her classes, I am afraid you will be very sorry you didn't.

In **March** we welcome **Judy Gauthier** for two umbrella classes and a Friday class using scraps from one of her books. The umbrella classes are nearly full, but there are spaces for her Friday class on Blended Hexagons. (We hope to have a sample for the January meeting.) There are several variations on that quilt that use that exact cutting technique, like Star Baby from the Rainbow Quilts for Scrap Lovers, and the Circus Comes to town. There is an additional variation on Star Baby as well. So, even though you are learning one quilt you are really learning several. You will also learn more about set in seams.




