

## Tiny landscapes & seascapes materials list:

- \_\_\_ sewing machine - in good working order
- \_\_\_ iron & ironing surface - ( 2 people can share one iron)
- \_\_\_ extension cord
- \_\_\_ cutting mat (approx. 12 X 18")
- \_\_\_ rotary cutter
- \_\_\_ ruler for trimming project
- \_\_\_ small & large fabric scissors
- \_\_\_ glue stick for fabric
- \_\_\_ flat head pins ( flower head pins work well)
- \_\_\_ basic individual sewing kit
- \_\_\_ neutral bobbin thread
- \_\_\_ thread : blue, green & other colors to match your fabrics

Fabric: visually textured cotton fabrics- Batiks work well; also tone on tone prints; small scale florals; plaids & prints. Bring what you love from your stash. Small amounts of your fabrics-( 1/8 to 1/4 yard cuts); also scraps (9"X 4" or larger)

### fabrics needed:

- \_\_\_ greens (7 or 8 different ones gradated dark to light)
  - \_\_\_ blues for water (8 or 9 gradated dark to light)
  - \_\_\_ 2 purples for mountains
  - \_\_\_ 2 blues for skies
  - \_\_\_ 2 textured browns for rocks
  - \_\_\_ tan for sand
  - \_\_\_ 1 white fabric
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- \_\_\_ small scraps of flat white lace for foam on the waves
  - \_\_\_ inner & outer border fabric (contrast color for inner border)  
(Outer borders will be cut later at 3" wide)
  - \_\_\_ 2 backing fabrics ( Fat quarters are great for this)
  - \_\_\_ 2 pieces of batting. (fat quarter size is big enough)
