Fabrics:

- Fabric 1: 1 1/2 yards of large floral
- Fabric Group 2: 1 yard each of light red and blue prints
- Fabric Group 3: 1 yard each of dark red and blue prints
- Fabric 4: 7/8 of a yard of dark red tonal for inner border
- Fabric 5: 2 1/4 yards of red and blue floral for outer border and binding



All Squared Up

Cutting Instructions:

PLEASE READ ALL OF THE INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE YOU BEGIN SEWING.

Fabric 1 (large floral):

- Cut 5 strips 8½" x width of fabric; crosscut 20 squares 8½" x 8½"

Fabric Group 2 (light red and blue prints)

- From each of the two fabrics, cut 14 strips 2" x width of fabric

Fabric Group 3 (dark red and blue prints):

- From each of the two fabrics, cut 14 strips 2" x width of fabric

Fabric 4 (dark red tonal for inner border):

- Cut 8 strips 3½" x width of fabric (set aside to use for inner border)

Fabric 5 (red and blue floral for outer border and binding):

- Cut 4 strips 8½" x length of fabric (set aside to use for outer border)
- Cut 4 strips 2¼" x length of fabric (set aside to use for binding)

CONSTRUCTING THE BLOCKS:

PLEASE READ ALL OF THE INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE YOU BEGIN SEWING.

Note: Standard ¼" seams are used throughout this project.

1. Sew each of the light red Fabric Group 2 strips to a dark red Fabric Group 3 strip; press to the dark red fabric. ▲




2. Crosscut ten of the strip sets into 8½" segments (you should have a total of 40 segments with some of each strip set left over).

3. Crosscut the remaining four strip sets and the leftover sections from Step 2, above, into 2" segments. You will need a total of 80 of these 2" segments. ▲



4. Using the 2" segments from Step 3, sew two segments together as shown at the right to form a total of 40 four-patch units. ▲



Note: These units should each measure 3½" x 3½". If not, adjust your seams allowances as necessary.

5. Using the diagram at the right as a guide, sew 4 of the four-patch units, 4 of the 8½" segments, and 1 of the Fabric 1 squares together into three rows (pressing the seams towards the 8½" segments). ▲
6. Sew the rows together and press seams.



Note: Make sure to position the four-patch units so that the light squares are at the outside corners and the dark fabric on the 8½" segments are towards the center of the block.

** Repeat Steps 5 and 6 to make a total of 10 red blocks


Note: Each block should each measure 14½" x 14½". If not, adjust your seams allowances as necessary.

** Repeat Steps 1-6 using the Fabric 2 and Fabric 3 blue strips to make a total of 10 blue blocks.

ASSEMBLING THE QUILT:

REFER TO THE DIAGRAM WHEN CONSTRUCTING THE QUILT CENTER AND ADDING THE BORDERS.

Quilt Center:

1. Arrange the completed blocks into 5 rows of 4 blocks as shown 
2. Sew into rows; press even rows in one direction and odd rows in the opposite direction.
3. Sew the rows together; press.

Border 1:

Measure the quilt from top to bottom through its vertical midpoint. Cut 2 Fabric 4 tonal red strips to that exact length (piecing, as necessary). Mark the center point of the quilt side edges and the center of the border strips. Pin a border strip to each quilt side (matching the center points and ends and easing as necessary). Sew the strips in place and press towards the border.

Border 2:

Repeat the above steps, using the Fabric 5 blue and red floral border strips and ensuring that your measurements include the previously added borders.

Layer, quilt and bind, as desired.
