I was so excited to go to Houston for the International Quilt Festival this year. I had never been before, so it was an overwhelming experience. I guess I expected the guilts to be orders of magnitude better than we mere mortals can make. Boy, was I wrong! There were lots of beautiful guilts there, but none were better than we have in our guilt show every year. The art quilts were amazing, with lots of thread painting, and special effects done with stitching, paints and fabrics. The more traditional guilts were also outstanding. There were lots of Double Wedding Ring guilts. Judy Niemeyer patterns, Karen Stone patterns, and beautiful applique quilts. But! We have quilts of equal beauty and technical skill in our show. It made me really proud to be associated with such talented quilters. We should consider trying to get some of our quilts into the Houston show.

I also took a class there and had a great instructor, but when I was looking in the catalogue for a class to take, I was surprised at how many of the instructors at Houston had also been to our guild. We really do get the best of the best instructors here, and at a greatly reduced price. The same classes we offer for \$45 were about \$135 in Houston. So please take advantage of the opportunity to take a course from the guild and save some money.

On a slightly different subject, I am interested in what kind of classes, or instructors, you would like the guild to have in the future. We try to book our instructors at least a year in advance, so if there is something, or someone, you would like us to try to bring for a class and program, please let me or Judy Brown (our new Program Chairperson) know. I would like another class in long-arm quilting, how about you? Hope we'll see you next month. Don't forget registration for our quilt show needs to be done by the first week in January.


