The meeting was called to order by Carla Mewhinney, President at 9 am at the South Texas High School for Health Professionals in Mercedes, Texas,

Secretary's minutes from the February meeting were adopted as published on the Web site with no additions or deletions made.

Treasurer's Report: Karon Jacobson reported that there is a balance of \$17,921.39 in the checking account and that she will move \$10,000.00 to the savings account. She also advised that anyone who was awarded a scholarship to attend a National Quilt Show had until September 1st to request reimbursement, after that the scholarship will go to the lst alternate on the list etc.

Lost & Found: Karon Jacobson has two bags that were left at previous meetings and asked that the owner's claim them.

General Announcements: Go with Jo Travel is putting together another Bus trip to the Houston Quilt Show for November 1st thru 4th. Please watch their web site for further information. UVAL – Fiber Arts Group has an Opening Reception tonight for their Fiber Art Pieces. Carla Mewhinney asked for a volunteer to do Publicity and Quilt Show Chair for 2019.

Student Scholarships: Evelyn Fincher introduced Nichole Castenada and Rene Cambolla as this year's recipients of the \$2,000 Scholarships. The Honey Bees gave \$50 as a Memorial for Pat Brothers and Marilyn Bannon and this will be added to each of the students (\$25 each).

Military Service: Deb Blackbourn announced that the sew days produced over 50 wheel chair quilts and 20+ regular quilts. Chris Cowan will be in charge over the summer. There will be a raffle of a Military Quilt with all proceeds going to purchase fabric etc., for the Military Service Quilts.

Youth Program: Florea Flores thanked everyone for their donations of fabric for this program and announced that there would be a class this next week with 5 students. If you have fabric you could donate please give to Florea or Rick and Subie Redd.

Hostess: Renee Darkis reports that we have 3 guests and 151 members present today.

Membership: Bonnie Hall announced that we now have 275 members. There will no longer be a printed copy of the Membership list. It is posted on the web site and you can print a copy from there. This avoids a cost of over \$700 to print them. The password to get into the Membership List is on your membership card if you rec'd it after January of this year. Those who got the card before then can contact Bonnie for the password.

4. Enter your quilt in next year's show for all to see and vote on.

Guild Encourages Student Fashion

Rene Gamboa and Nicole Castaneda each received a 2017 scholarship award letter for \$2,000 at the March 11 meeting of the Rio Grande Valley Quilt Guild.

Gamboa, a senior at Sharyland High School in Edinburg and Castaneda, a sophomore at Texas State University, were chosen from six scholarship applicants. Castaneda also received one of the 2016 Guild student scholarships.

The criteria for scholarship selection is based on printed Guild guidelines and state that the applicant must be a graduating high school senior and plan to attend college and major or minor in "the arts related to

textiles, including fashion, designing, pattern making, study of materials, dyes, color, and other textile-related studies". Other considerations are extracurricular activities and grade point average. In the event there are no qualified high school senior applicants for the two scholarships, former scholarship students who plan to continue their studies according to the Guild guidelines may apply for consideration.

Letters were mailed by Evelyn Fincher, High School/College Scholarship Committee Chairman, to Rio Grande Valley high school counselors and art departments. Other members of the committee are Donna Brown and Judy Bassett. Final selection approval is made by the RGVQG Executive Board.

Fincher introduced Gamboa and Castaneda and the students introduced their guests. Gamboa's guests were Maria Bhatt, his mother, Bertha Alvarez, his grandmother, and his aunt, Alma Alvarez. Gamboa plans to attend either The Art Institute of San Antonio or Austin Community College, Austin.

He expressed a desire to continue his studies in fashion design and marketing. His goals include joining a major fashion house and promoting his own fashion designs. He stated he is already working on his designs.

Castaneda introduced her dad, Alfredo Castaneda, and her sister, Lauren Castaneda. She then shared some of her experiences as a freshman at Texas State University where she will continue her studies in fashion merchandising and marketing.

She expressed her enjoyment of her textiles studies and expressed a desire to "own a clothing store and promote better use of textiles" especially regarding the protection of textile workers and the environment.

Both students expressed their appreciation to their parents for their support and encouragement. Students and parents thanked Guild members for the scholarship opportunity.

Fincher presented award letters to the students and explained the procedure for receipt of the award checks. A RGVQG representative will present certificates to the scholarship winners at their respective high school awards assemblies in May.

In addition to the \$2,000 award, each student will receive \$50 extra. The Honey Bees donated \$50 in memory of their deceased members, Pat Brothers and Marilyn Bannon. Linda Haderer also donated \$50 to a "worthwhile cause."

Guild members, we have once again empowered better fashion design and marketing through our selection of Rene Gamboa and Nicole Castaneda!


