RGVQG General Meeting - April 8, 2017

The meeting was called to order by Carla Mewhinney, President at 9:05 am.

The Secretary's minutes from the March meeting were adopted as published on the web site with no additions or corrections.

Treasurer, Karon Jacobson reports that there is \$7,484.90 in the checking account.

Membership Chair, Bonnie Hall reports that we now have 279 members. She also advised the membership that if there were any questions regarding the web site to please contact her.

Hostess, Renee Darkis reports that there are 98 members and 10 guests present today.

Community Service, Rick Redd reports that in the month of March there were 1,904 items donated for a total of 7,315 hours and a value of \$50,033.75. The quarterly report showed 3,803 items for a total of 13,230 hours and a value of \$95,917.50.

Military Service Quilts: Chris Cowan asked for volunteers to inventory the quilts. We were advised that Green Gate Grove Park has pictures of all the quilts they have made.

Block of the Month: Joan Ploeg, last months winner showed her completed items and rec'd a \$25 gift certificate for classes. The winner of the blocks this month is Karen Knowlton. The BOM for May is September 7th, Fan Dance. Please use a white background with a yellow center and bright colors for the outside blocks. This will be a 6 ½" block.

Programs: Judy Brown reports that all programs have been scheduled and she has contracts from Ricky Tims and Karen K. Stone. Please see the web site as the classes and lectures will soon be posted for enrollment.

Schoolhouse: Karen Dill reports that Joy Paugh will be doing the summer registration.

Miscellaneous: Go With Jo will once again be doing a bus trip to the Houston Show for a reported cost of \$389/person. Please contact Go With Jo for further information.

The Executive Board voted to allow those eligible for scholarships to attend any educational class held by a recognized National Speaker. The one exclusion would be speakers at our Guild Meetings and Shows. Remember, you must return to guild and do a demo/lecture on the class and what you learned.

Quilt Show: Alice Gibson thanked all who were working on the Board for their hard work in pulling the 2018 Show together and reminded us of the following: 1. There will be an Appraiser at the show; 2. Judy Blum is in charge of the Miniature Auction. Maximum size of the quilt is 36" x 36" and there are several books in the guild library on miniatures; 3. Challenge Quilts must be no more that 24" x 24"; 4. The Opportunity Quilt Prize for selling tickets will be a Sewing Machine; 5. Volunteers will get in free with 2 ½ hours of service and finally 6. We have 5 hotels giving discounts on reservations.

Retreat: Karen Heaney reports that there were 18 new retreaters this year and that she now has a waiting list for next year.

- 4. Enter your quilt in next year's show for all to see and vote on.




