

RGVQG General Meeting - May 13th, 2017

Rio Grande Valley Quilt Guild – General Meeting May 13th, 2017

The meeting was called to order by Carla Mewhinney, President at 9 am.

Secretary's Report: There being no additions, deletions or corrections to the minutes from the April meeting, they were adopted as posted in the newsletter.

Treasurer's Report: There is \$3,989.37 in the checking account. All taxes have been submitted and the accountant paid. Karon Jacobson has two bags of fleece donated by Barbara Walker.

Membership: Mike Hall stepped in today as Bonnie is ill at home. We have two new members who were introduced to our group.

Community Service: For the month of April there were 133 items donated for a total of 929 hours and a value of \$6,735.25. The forms to fill out are on the web site as are locations where the quilts can be donated. If you wish to donate to another site/person please fill out the form and give to Rick or Subie Redd after donating it. They will figure out the hours/value per the IRS.

Hostess: There were 59 present today with 5 visitors.

Programs: The enrollment for the Ricky Tims; Karen K. Stone and Rob Appell classes will be available on 5/14/17 on the web site. Please sign up for only one class at this time in order to allow everyone a chance to attend. In June the classes will be opened up for you to sign up for a second class.

The Barn Quilt Class to be held in February will be on the web at TBA date.

Carla announced that Cindy Roth with Longarm University will be here next month. She will do two, all day classes. These classes are open to guild members only and will cost \$225/day or \$425 for both days. A different class will be held each day and the class is limited to 6 students. Contact Renee Darkis or Carla Mewhinney as the classes will be held on June 8th and 9th before our next meeting. Cindy will be the Guest speaker at the Guild Meeting in June.

Ricky Tims has asked us to promote his Luminarium Class to our members and throughout the Valley. In return he will donate merchandise and one admission to his two-day class following our Quilt Show in January. He, in turn, will advertise our Quilt Show on his site.

Schoolhouse: Please sign up for classes. All classes have been scheduled for next season and Joy Paugh is here to get you registered.

Sunshine & Shadows: Stella Sneider has had surgery and is very ill, Bonnie Hall is under the weather. Please keep them in your prayers.

Newsletter: All news from guild/bees is due on the 15th. Please give this news directly to Jackie Heyes.

Quilt Show: Alice reports via Carla that things are moving along. Pins were ordered and rec'd. Volunteers may sign up next month.

A QUILT SHOW CHAIRMAN FOR 2019 is still needed. Please volunteer so that you can work with Alice and get a feel for the job.

Military Service Quilts: Chris Cowan, Carla Mewhinney and Renee Darkis took an inventory of the quilts in storage and we have a lot. Renee Darkis contacted the Veterans Nursing Home in McAllen and they have a total of 167 beds with 137 current veterans. She brought this info to the Board and it was decided, after contacting the Activity Director at the Home, that the Guild would present quilts to all

patients on July 4th. These quilts need labels and they will be made, and a sew day scheduled to sew these on the quilts and sort out all the fabric in the storage shed.

We also have at least 22 other people who have been nominated for quilts and these will be given out in addition to two quilts to nominees who have not rec'd their quilts yet.

The raffle quilt to raise funds for Military Service Quilts is at GOB Quilts. Please get your tickets from Chris Cowan or at GOB quilts.

Block of Month: Karen Knowlton completed her quilt from last month's blocks and will receive a gift certificate for a class. This month's winner is Jo Corey. Bonnie has decided not to use the Calendar for next month's block and instead has designed "Bonnie's Flower Garden" block. This is a $6\frac{1}{2}$ " block requiring 3 strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " in a flower print of your choice and two $-2\frac{1}{2}$ " white squares. Please see the pictures on the facebook page for placement. This is a very easy square and should get a lot of participants.

Friendship Day: Friendship day is held in September in place of the meeting. This is a potluck etc. day. Llano Grande ladies have stepped up to be Hostess's for the day. It is always a fun time.

Carla reminded the members that they need to be thinking about who they would like to see nominated for the positions of President, 3rd Vice President and Secretary. Nominations need to be published in the October newsletter. Both Carla Mewhinney and Judi Swanda will not run again. Judy Brown will probably continue as Program Chair as she is currently filling out this position that was vacated. (and doing a great job).

The only down-side of this is that the Military Service Quilt inventory will be depleted. We continue to receive requests for quilts; and that means we need to have more inventory. Alice Gibson, the Quilt Show Chairperson, would like to have 50 Military Service Quilts to hang at the Quilt Show in January. The Military Service Room uses 5 for display purposes; and we need a minimum of 10 for presentations to Veterans at the Quilt Show.

Chris and I are reaching out to you, as generous quilters, in hopes that you might be willing to sew Military Service Quilts sometime during your summer. They should be red, white and blue, 60" x 72". So, I have all my red, white and blue fabric pulled and ready to start sewing! If you can help, terrific! Thank you!

She will be teaching her Traveling Longarm Classes in Alamo, TX on June 8 & 9, and giving our Saturday lecture on Continuous Curve Quilting. The Guild meeting is open to all quilters, however there is a \$10 fee for non-members. On May 15 both December and January program class registrations went live and were posted on Facebook. Within three hours, over 50 members had successfully registered. Currently members can register for November Sue Nickel's classes, December Rob Appell's classes, or January Quilt Show program classes and concert with Ricky Tims or classes with Karen K. Stone. We do expect all to fill, so please plan to register as soon as possible. Members have been asked to only register for one of Rob's or Karen's classes until June 1 to enable more members to register. (Several had expressed interest in registering for multiple classes.)

Additional information:

Sue Nickels has added an additional Tuesday class "Learn all about stitched raw edge machine appliqué in this informative workshop. Sue's book "Stitched Raw Edge Appliqué" co-authored with her sister Pat Holly is the basis for this class. A small amount of fusible is used to seal the edge yet leaves the block soft. The machine blanket stitching makes this project secure for washing. Students will work on a practice sampler of ideas in class to learn the technique. Explore the details of inside and outside points, curves, circles and a great bias stem option. This is a technique class which allows time to explore the details of the technique. Feel confident to work on any appliqué pattern after taking this class." The book is not required.

Class Descriptions Free Hand Sampler

Free hand designs are fun and easy to do and will give your quilting a very "custom" look with minimal effort! In this hands on class you will learn many different free hand patterns and how to use them to fill in typical spaces - squares, half square triangles - and those unusual spaces on your quilts.

We will also discuss and create "overall" free hand patterns, which are like pantographs, but easier and faster!

If desired, bring an un-quilted quilt or two for show and tell and for quilting suggestions. If you quilt as a business, this class will show you how to quilt effectively and efficiently. As always, there is plenty of time for questions, answers and networking.

The basis of this class is the book Free Hand Sampler by Cindy Roth and the NEW DVD Free Hand Sampler V-2. Each person attending this class receives a copy of this book, the laminated drawing sheets AND the DVD!!

Everyone loves feathers! But feathers, although beautiful, can sometimes be the "problem child" of the quilting world.



Not only will you learn the basics of making feathers, you will also learn how to make the "More Bang for the Buck" feather, Swirled Feathers, Feathered Wreaths, many different Feather Borders, All Over Free Hand Feathers, background fill-in feathers and much more! You will be seeing feathers in your sleep and making beautiful and easy feathers on your quilts.

If you quilt as a business, you NEED to know how to quilt feathers! Feathers are the "cash cow" in a quilting business. I will show you my tips and tricks for making feathers that look good and fill spaces. With feathers, quilts can be finished quickly, which means more \$\$\$ for you, and the quilts look great which makes for HAPPY CUSTOMERS!! Class handouts include a Beginning Feathers DVD and laminated worksheet..

Bee News


