

- 1) Gather 16 Roundabouts, 16 Roads & Hedges, and 16 Cliffs of Moher.
- 2) Sew a Road & Hedges to the left side of the Roundabout, make 16 of these. Press toward the Roundabout.
- 3) Sew a Cliffs of Moher to the right side of a Roundabout, with the Dk. Background at the bottom, repeat on all 16 Roundabouts. Press toward the Roundabout.

 - Fashion Show is a hot item on the program again this year. The registration is on the website. Please complete the form with as much information as possible about your garment for the commentary. We are hoping for group projects as well as individual items to demonstrate our very skilled designers of wearable arts.
- ★ Small quilts, at the meeting Saturday, we had only 22 quilts in the Yellow Bag. This group is part of our fund-raising $\stackrel{\wedge}{\Rightarrow}$ for the guild. These guilts are to be no more than 36 x 36". 
