RGVQG General Meeting Minutes, April 14, 2018

The meeting was called to order by the President, Kathe LeTulle, at 9:00 am.

The Secretary minutes from the March meeting are posted in the newsletter an on-line.

Treasurer-Karon Jacobson: Karon gave the bank balance of \$3,223.60 with \$50,000.00 in savings.

2019 Opportunity Quilt Tickets-Diane Hines: Each member is encouraged to sell tickets for the opportunity quilt. For each book of ticket's a member sells, a ticket will be placed in a drawing for one of two \$150.00 gift certificates, one from A BLOCK AWAY quilt shop and the other from GOB Quilts. The Quilt Committee can now receive credit card payments for the opportunity quilt tickets and admission to the quilt show.

Library-Vicki Guerra: Vicki gave a quick reminder to those that are leaving for the summer. Please return library books before you go. Do not take them north or leave them in your residence in the valley. Vicki also thanked those that had returned books.

Community Service-Rick Redd: The March Community Service report was 426 items, 7071 hours, and \$51,264.75 value. The first quarter figures are \$120,683.50. The 2017 year totaled \$195,000. The goal of \$200,000.00 for 2018 will be reached prior to the end of the year. Rick thanks you for your participation. Rick also said that they are again providing quilts to neo natal and hospice patients. If you care to donate Block of the Month blocks/ projects to the Community Service, it would be appreciated.

Speaker – Dr. Frank Gerold, MD, Orthopedic and Hand Surgery of Valley Care Clinics, McAllen Texas.

Kathe LeTulle announced a break of 15 minutes after Dr. Gerold's presentation. The meeting resumed at 10:25 am.

Kathe asked us all to keep Karon Jacobson in our prayers. Karon spoke briefly about her recent diagnosis of colon cancer. Karon will undergo 6 weeks of chemo and radiation. In August she will undergo surgery, after surgery she will go thru another 4 weeks of chemo. She thanks us all for our thoughts, prayers and concern for her.

Retreats-Elaine Hall: Elaine will be available at the meetings to add members to the wait list for the 2019 quilt retreats.

Schoolhouse Classes-Karen Dill: The Killer Bee's – Sandy Gurney will be on hand during the summer months to answer questions about the classes and assist folks in signing up for the 2018-2019 classes. The Schoolhouse Class registration is now on line.

Sunshine and Shadows-Maggie Putney: Maggie sent out thank you notes to the stores that provided door prizes for the 2018 retreats. Maggie also sent a sympathy card to Claudette Shaver's family.

Block of the Month-Bonnie Cassidy: Sue Worrel won the March blocks as well as the April Blocks. Sue presented her completed project from the March blocks via a friend in the guild. The April blocks will be mailed to her. The May Block of the Month will be October 20, Old Maids Puzzle. All blocks should be finished at 8.5 inches. Karon Jacobson will post the picture and information on the Facebook Page. Members can also take a picture of the calendar page provided by Bonnie.

Membership-Bonnie Hall: The guild now has 302 members. Today we had 2 guests and 94 members present, a total of 96 in attendance. Bonnie is also the Webmaster. If you have questions regarding the website, please contact Bonnie. Bonnie commented that the 2018-2019 Schoolhouse Classes and the Speakers and their classes are all on line. Membership registration may be performed on line.

Military Service Quilts-Carla Mewhinney: MSQ are looking for folks to quilt the quilts. Bundles will be put together this next week and will be ready for quilting. Future sew days have not been scheduled.

Evening in the Valley:

The Story of the Opportunity Quilt By Alice Gibson

Our Weslaco Heritage Bee knew it was about time we did the opportunity quilt again, as it was 13 years since the last one, everyone agreed " no appliqué this time". We also wanted something that would represent some aspect of the Valley. Everyone brought their ideas and it wasn't hard to decide our choice.

We contacted Marcie Baker to allow us to use her pattern and amend it to take it from a wall hanging to a bed sized quilt. She offered to work with us to sketch our design and assist in calculating the amount of fabric needed. We decided to order Jenny Byers collection of fabric so we could create the effect we wanted.

Everyone contributed for one whole season, self selected of course, cutters, putting pieces together, sewers who put the pieces together, pressers, unsewers, repeat the process till blocks were complete. Once person volunteered to sew the blocks together, this was easy because so much attention had been put into the initial construction.

Elaine Cooke volunteered to make the wall hanging and I quilted it on my long arm quilter. Kathleen Dombi volunteered to make the miniature. In her expert style, she replicated the quilt to a REAL miniature as was her specialty in the group.

With contribution of our total membership the pieces came together and we are very pleased with final result. The name was selected by the bee after a brainstorming discussion we agreed to the one we chose.

Thanks to all the members of The Weslaco Heritage Bee! This was the third opportunity quilt some of the members had been involved in!






