RGVQG General Meeting Minutes, May 12, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 am by Kathe LeTulle, President.

Kathe asked the members to consider being hosts for the Friendship Day in September 2018. The Friendship Day will be held at Alamo Rec-Veh.

Fat Quarter Draw: Subie and Rick Redd have resigned as the coordinators of the Fabric Draw. Their last draw will be in August. Sandy Gurney has agreed to organize the draw with Esther Schmidt as her assistant.

Speaker: Kathe LeTulle introduced Priscilla "Pris" Wodzinski as our speaker. Musings from a Quilter's Spouse.

2019 Quilt Challenge for the Quilt Show: Printed instructions for the Quilt Challenge are available today.

Military Service Quilts: Carla Mewhinney asked if any group would like to sponsor/host a sew day to see her. Carla and Rene have purchased 160 yards of fabric, they are also making kits for service quilts. There is a military quilt to be presented in Brownsville, Carla is looking for a member that might live in Brownsville to present the quilt. 2 new dyes were purchased for the kits, a Turn Dash and Hunter Star. More kits will be available in June.

Programs: Lila Helm standing in for Judy Brown, reminded the members that Karen Kay Stone classes are now available for registration on-line. Judy is providing first choice to those that were signed up for her class last year. Judy will hold your spots for a week. Please notify Judy Brown if you plan to attend this class. Also, if you have a certificate that you want to use for payment, email Judy and then mail the certificate to her.

Community Service: Rick Redd said that CS is going to purchase a Accu-Quilt cutter for making neonatal and pre-natal quilt kits. The CS April numbers: 418 items, 2588 hours, and \$180,763.00 value. He and Subie had set a goal for 2018-2019 year for a value of \$200,000. As of the end of April, the total is \$150,000.00, he believes the goal is within reach.

Secretary: Joy Paugh said the April Minutes were posted in the April newsletter. No changes or corrections were noted. The minutes are filed as posted.

Retreats: Kayrn Heaney reported that both retreats are full, however there are waiting lists. The last few years the waiting list has been used to fill openings. If you want to attend one of the retreats, please sign up on the waiting list.

Block of the Month: Bonnie Cassidy said the Block of the Month winner for April was Karen Knowlton. Karen sent a picture of her completed project. Bonnie will mail her a certificate of \$25.00. Mary Britton is the May winner. The June block is September 21, Pieced Box. The information will be posted on the FB page and in the newsletter.

Membership: Bonnie Hall reported we now have 304 members. If you have questions, email or call Bonnie. 61 in attendance today with no guests.

2019 Quilt Show: Debi Warner and Laurel Powell presented a short skit on making items for the Quilt Boutique. Debi challenged each of us to make an item for the boutique, there would be 304 items in the boutique. These are the new chair people for the show: Karen Hunger, Volunteers; Laurel Powell, Publicity; Linda Osborne, Receiving. Debi needs a chairman for the Quilt Registration. The registration will be on line this year. The Quilt Show Schedule and the 2 new quilt categories are completed. There will be a separate category for hand work. The other category will be called Chairs Choice. This is not a permanent category. Each year the chairman can define the category. 2019 the definition will be 50% recycled material. The fabric used must be pre-used or had a previous life. The Quilt Board wants to thank the Guild board for approving the RGVQG to be a member of the SPI Chamber of Commerce.

Being a member of the Chamber gives us the advantage of their relationships with business and groups on the island. By being a member of the SPI Chamber of Commerce, we have entry to local chambers. There is a new RGV Quilt Show Facebook page. This page is an open page.

Treasurer: Kathe LeTulle provided the figures for Karon Jacobson. \$1,795.63 in the checking account and \$49,000.00 in the savings account.

Quilt Categories

There will be two major changes to the quilt categories this year. Some minor changes have also been made to quilt sizes to better balance the categories, but these will not impact your summer sewing.

The two major changes are:

(1) A separate category for Hand Quilting. Quilts in this category will be more than 50% hand work such as hand quilting, hand applique, hand embroidery, etc.

A category has been added for a Chair's Choice. This will allow the category to change each year to feature more styles, although these may or may not become permanent categories. One chair might choose red work, while another might want to feature modern quilting.

(2) This is the Chair's Choice is **Recycling.** Quilts entered in this category must have **a top** that has at least 50% recycling material. Recycled is defined as having had a previous life as a garment, previous quilt, or object. Material which had not been previously USED and has been acquired from sale, swap, or rescue from a scrap bin does NOT count as recycled. The quilt back and batting need not be recycled.

For example, if the quilt is wool applique, it must have 50% of it's fabric from wool coats, skirts, old blankets, etc. Please address any questions to quiltshow@rgvqg.com.

Welcome back renewing members – Kathryn Webber's Graphics.




We will vote on our favorites at a guild meeting closer to the show. You might even win some prize money.



12"	A 37/8"	B 🔀 71/4"






