RIO GRANDE VALLEY QUILT GUILD General Meeting, Saturday, October 13, 2018

President, Kathe LeTulle opened the meeting at 9:00am.

Secretary – Joy Paugh: The September meeting was annual Friendship Day, therefore there was no minutes for that meeting.

Treasurer – Karon Jacobson: Bank Balance: \$1,590.07. Savings Balance: \$36,000.00 approximate.

November 17, 2018 will be our next general meeting. November is our annual Guild elections. This November the Membership (1st VP), Treasurer, and the Community Service positions are up for re-election.

2019 Rummage Sale – Evelyn Fincher: Today's rummage sale will begin once the general meeting has adjourned. Sellers, please take items that did not sell.

Block of the Month – Bonnie Cassidy: Please check the website and the September newsletter to see the Block of the Month for November.

Retreat – Karyn Heaney: Polo Shirts are here to be ordered and paid for.

Programs – Judy Brown: Programs have been slated thru March 2020. Registration has been slow for this season. Karen Kay Stones class for November has openings. The Guild is proud to be able to provide classes for the nationally recognized teacher for \$45.00. Any other place they would be much higher. The new website is up and running. The website is readable and useable on phones and tablets as well as laptops and desktops. Hosts are needed for speakers in 2019. Please see Judy Brown if your Bee would like to help host a speaker. Responsibility is airport pickup/delivery, pickup and deliver for classes and Guild meeting, possibly meals with your Bee. Please check the website for the 2019/2020 classes and register for a class.

Military Service Quilts – Renee Darkis: The Guild provides quilts to veterans in the valley. Renee and Carla have about 50 quilts bundled and ready for quilting. See Renee to pick up a quilt.

Newsletter – Diana Wolf: Diana encouraged Bee's to send her a sentence or two of what activity their Bee has been involved in. These make great articles for the newsletter. The deadline for October newsletter articles is Monday, October 15, 2018.

2019 Quilt Show – Debi Warner: Quilters Walk (raffle of themed bags) – two bags were shown today. Debi encourages those who have made bags for the Quilters Walk to bring them to the November and December meeting for show and tell. Boutique items turned in for the quilt show were visors, kitchen boas, and small pouches. Registration of quilts can be done at a BEE location, please see Bonnie or Mike Hall. The word from Debi was REGISTER for the quilt show. Register to volunteer, register a quilt, register for programs and classes, register for hotels. Subie Redd showed a sample base for the banners being displayed at the participating hotels, restaurants, as well as the birding and turtle centers. Members will supply the fabric and complete the 'quilted' base. Subie will add the dates etc. of the 2019 quilt show. Blue Bay and SunChaser are 2 additional hotels that will provide special rates for the quilt show.

Membership – Bonnie Hall: The membership cost is \$25.00. The membership can be purchased on line. The membership cards will be distributed the meeting after your registration. The back of the membership card shows the password to the protected member information on the website.

Guild programs being held at the Alamo Rec-Veh require chair and table set up. If you are presenting at the meeting and need specific set up, please connect with Judi Swanda.

Volunteers are needed for these positions: Librarian, School House Classes, and Newsletter. See Kathe LeTulle if you are interested.

Dale Shafer is teaching a School House Class on fabric boxes on November 29. Dale will provide varying sizes for the fabric boxes.

Reminder: The November 17 meeting will experience a larger attendance, as the Winter Texans will be returning. Parking at the Alamo Rec-Veh must be done on the north side of the street leading east. Do not park on the south side in the large spaces, your vehicle will be towed away. Watch signs and park accordingly.

At the January 2019 Guild meeting the mini-quilts and the challenge quilts will be displayed and voted on. Mike Hall is encouraging the membership to enter quilts in these categories. Also, in order for these quilts to be in the 2019 Quilt Show they need to be registered by the end of January 2019.

Volunteer Sign Up for work at the 2019 Quilt Show can be done at the November Guild meeting. The Quilt Show is February 15 and 16 at the Padre Island Convention Center.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:45am.

Please be careful where you park for Guild meetings at Alamo Rec-Veh.








Bee News




