PRESIDENTS THREADS THAT BIND

The May Guild Meeting Lecture and Quilts by Laurie Magee – "Back in the Day – Quilt Trends, Colors and Patterns" was so filled with knowledge that had she not had the quilts to confirm pertinent information, we would been on information overload. Her display of quilts was very overwhelming. Beauty (applique, etc.) and the Beast (utilitarian quilts) were represented. Truly enjoyed seeing all the different patterns and taught to recognize the dated era with her direction. A lot goes into appraising a quilt – the newest fabric will date the quilt with loads more information. Thank you so much Laurie for an exciting SHOW AND TELL.

At the Quilt Show 2020, an appraiser will be on hand. Her fee to appraise a quilt will be \$50.00 – either entered in the show or requested independently. For insurance purposes, remember if your quilt is not appraised and there is a disaster (fire, flood, etc.) your insurance will only allow Wal Mart Blanket pricing. You be the judge.

The appraiser will also do privately and pro-actively what is called "judged" or a professional critique of the quilt. If you have an interest into entering into a JUDGED QUILT SHOW, the private information will be an asset. She will define in writing positives and negatives to assist in helping you overcome negative barriers and become uplifted by the things you do positively. The fee is only \$5.00 with a limit of 50. Take advantage if you can.

One of the things that I enjoy about the SHOW AND TELL at the guild meeting is all the exciting colors, patterns, and positive vibes that the members exude when showing their projects. We are so blessed to have this wonderful opportunity in house. A big thank you goes to Karon Jacobson, for the photographs taken at the meeting and posted on the Guild Facebook site.

Do not forget the BLOCK OF THE MONTH. Make a block and join in the fun of it all.

Remember to return the guild LIBRARY BOOKS. Other members may wish to check the books out.


RIBBON WEAVE


