Just a reminder: At the Quilt Show 2020, an appraiser will be on hand. Her fee to appraise a quilt will be \$50.00 – either entered in the show or requested independently. Remember for Insurance Purposes, if your quilt is not appraised and there is a disaster (fire, flood, etc.) your insurance will only allow Wal Mart Blanket pricing. You be the judge.

The appraiser will also do privately and pro-actively what is called "judged" or a professional critique of the quilt. If you have an interest into entering into a JUDGED QUILT SHOW, the private information will be an asset. She will define in writing positives and negatives to assist in helping you overcome negative barriers and become uplifted by the things you do positively. The fee is only \$5.00 with a limit of 50. Take advantage if you can.

We have included some compliance wording to help retain our 501 C 3 tax exempt status with the IRS and the State of Texas. The bylaws are being submitted for your consideration in the following format: a column on the left with the existing wording, and another column on the right showing changes. Where words have been removed, that word or words show a line, a "strike through" through the letters. Where word or words were added, these words appear in red.

#### **Youth News**

As the school year comes to a close, parents are looking for a constructive activity to engage their kids in the summer. Most education professionals advise parents to keep their kids engaged in activities that continue to challenge their brains and keep them learning throughout the summer months. One such activity is sewing. Texas A&M AgriLife Extension-Hidalgo County is hosting a summer quilting youth program with the Master Clothing Volunteers in the month of June. Knowing how to sew is a useful life skill with lifelong practical applications and many health benefits, said Joanne Ureste FCH Agent. Research finds sewing requires concentration, problem solving skills, hand-eye coordination and fine motor skills.

In the month of June, the youth will learn how to make a Quilt Block Quilt. Florea Flores, lead Master Clothing Volunteer, along with three Master Clothing Volunteers will teach eight youth during the month of June.

This is the third year, Nayeli has participated in the youth quilting class. Nayeli mentioned she looks forward to attending the quilting classes, because it challenges her every year. "I have made a block quilt and a star quilt. I am excited to see what I will sew this year!" said Nayeli

Not only do you see the kids growing tall, but you noticed their sewing skill level has progressed. "I remember teaching Melody how to thread her machine and sew in a straight line. Now Melody is sewing with no problem and is using a rotary cutter!" said Rosie Garza, Master Clothing Volunteer Member.

Sewing has not only taught the youth life skills, but has built friendship and strengthen family time. Most of the youth parents attend the class

because they enjoy spending time with their child and they enjoy learning together. Melizabeth Cantu, parent of Melody Coronado, mentioned these sewing classes have made so many great memories. 




