RGVQG November 9, 2019 General Meeting Minutes

The November meeting began at 9 A.M.

Kathe LeTulle, President, introduced our national speaker, Cynthia England. Cynthia presented a program on pictorial quilts – Picture Piecing.

The RGVQG Business meeting began at 10:50 A.M.

Kathe made an announcement that our Librarian, Susan Coleman's husband John is in critical condition at a local hospital. Kathe asked that we keep them in our prayers.

Elections: Judy Brown and the Nomination Committee: Pam Manley, Cathy Mott, Jan Baethke, Carla Mewhinney, announced the newly elected officers. President – Kathe LeTulle. Programs/3rd VP – Laural Powell. Secretary – Diana Wolf. Congratulations to the winners and thank you to Renee Darkis and Karon Jacobson for running. Items on the ballot: 2020 Budget passed, 144 in favor and 1 against. Increase of School House Class fees from \$10.00 to \$20.00 beginning November of 2020 passed, 122 in favor and 23 against. Increase of membership dues from \$25.00 per year to \$30.00 per year beginning with 2020 year, passed. 136 for and 10 against. FYI: numerous locations on the website will be updated to accommodate these changes.

2020 Quilt Show – Marsha Santow: Marsha informed the membership that the quilt show is on course. Marsha is looking for a person to be the Receiving and Returning Quilt committee chairperson. A step by step guide is available. Deb Warner, Boutique Chair, encouraged the membership to make items for the boutique. Killer Bees, Harlingen, will host a boutique sew day on January 22, 2020. Information will be in the newsletter and on the website. Karen Hunger, Chair for Volunteers, encouraged members to go to the website and sign up.

Military Service Quilts – Pam Manley: Monday, November 11, 21 quilts will be presented at Brookridge in Pharr. A wall hanging will be presented to Heritage. Two Military Sew Days are scheduled in January, the 15th at Snow to Sun with lunch included and January 29 at Trophy Gardens. Quilts are presented to Valley residents only.

Treasurer – Diane Tewell: Thanked the membership for passing the budget as well as the increase of School House Class fees and membership dues. The extra income will afford the Guild to pay our standing financial obligations. October ending Bank Balance, \$3,803.60. October ending Savings Account Balance, \$33,142.82. Retreat Account, \$3,000.00.

Quilt Show Banners and Flyer packets were distributed by Paula McCutchan.

Quilt Show Challenge – Paula McCutchan: Once Upon a Time Quilt Show Quilt Challenge. 200 inches maximum. 3 different quilt techniques. Must be registered for the show. See the website for more information.

Programs – Judy Brown: Classes for Cynthia England were almost filled. December 14, 2019 Tina Hilton of Turtle Hand Batik will be our speaker and teacher. Tina will give (2) one-half day classes at \$25.00 with a \$20.00 kit. January, Karen Combes. February meeting will not have a speaker. The February Quilt Show will have a speaker and lecturer. March, Angela Walters. Judy encouraged everyone to register early for the classes.

Small Quilt Auction – Quilt Show – Judy Blum: Judy provided ideas for small quilts. This year a 'buy it now' price will be attached to each quilt as well as a silent auction list. Judy is retiring from this committee. The 2021 Quilt Show will be looking for a Small Quilt Auction Chairperson.

Retreat – Elaine Hall for Karyn Heaney: The retreats are full however there are waiting lists. The Friendship Retreat final payment due at the December meeting. The Bluebonnet Retreat final payment is due at the January 2020 meeting.

2020 Quilt Show Bags and Totes – Linda Haderer/ Diana Wolf: Linda shared a few bags and totes that have been donated for the raffle. Linda encourages the membership to fill the bags with themed items.

Opportunity Quilt Tickets – Sarah Reed: Sarah thanks those that have picked up their opportunity tickets. Sarah, personally, is gathering items for the Family Crisis Center in Harlingen, home for abused women. She is asking members if they might want to donate non-perishable food. The center can use twin-size quilts, see Sarah if you are interested.

2021 Quilt Show Chairperson – Laurie Magee: Laurie has a quilt appraiser coming to the 2020 quilt show in February. Sign up on line for a \$50.00 written appraisal or a \$25 verbal appraisal. Appraisals are important for insurance purposes. The appraisal / critique is also important for the quilter that is considering entering a quilt in a juried quilt show. The appraiser has agreed to return 10% of the appraisal fee to the GUILD and half of the critique fee.

Membership – Marty Morrison: 13 new members. 130 members for the year of 2020.

Winter Haven Bee – Deb Williams: Deb is seeking quilters to join the Winter Haven group at the Main House at Creations/Kerrville for a retreat. Cost is \$350.00. Dec 11 to 15th, 2019. See Deb.

We will be collecting bags at the December meeting.


Upcoming Programs

Click here to obtain 2020 guild directory. The directory is password protected. Please contact me if you have problems downloading the directory or need the password.

3.) Are you having problems registering for a program or schoolhouse class? One of the issues may be with the payment choices.



If you have a PayPal account, use the top choice or second if you have PayPal CREDIT, but if you have a VISA, MasterCard, Discovery, etc., choose the bottom Debit or Credit Card. You will either be sent to PayPal to log in or be asked details about your credit card. After completing it, you will see a **Continue** choice. Choose that and your credit card will process after which you will return to our form to press Submit. You will receive a conformation screen that you are registered, plus you will receive an email confirmation. Within 24-48 hours you can see your name on the link described above in #1.)




