

In April, Gudrun was named the #1 most influential quilter by Quilting Daily. She has led two Quarantine Quilt Alongs (QQA) with Elvira in March with 16,000 quilters from 37 countries and Hope QQA in May. I watch her on Facebook every Tuesday and Friday and really love her patterns.




