Both the November and December Schoolhouse classes have been well attended and have provided the attendees with new skills. I hope you will check out what is planned for January, February and March.

All classes will be in-person at Trophy Gardens, in the card room, down the hall where the restrooms are. We had the December class there, and found the room to be excellent for classes.

Classes are open to all Guild members for a fee of \$20. Non-members may attend by joining the Guild first. Classes will be held the first Friday of each month from 9:00am to 3:00pm with a break for lunch. Feel free to bring your lunch, or else you can go out to one of the local restaurants.

To register for a class, go to the main page of the Guild website...RGVQG.com. Each Schoolhouse class is listed, with a link to enroll. Once you click on the link, you will need to fill in the form and provide a method of payment.

January:

Friday, January 7, 2022 - "Siddi Style Kawandi Table Runner"

Instructor: Pat Cooper

The Siddis are Indians of Southeastern African descent. Their quilts are distinctive in their use of color and the technique used in which patches of repurposed clothing are placed over a foundation and hand stitched with a running stitch. Your stitches don't need to be perfect or uniform. Pat will explain the process with lots of visuals that will help you create your own Siddi style Kawandi table runner.

February:

Friday, February 4, 2022 - "Four Patch Explosion" Instructor: Marty Morrison

When is a Four Patch not your usual Four Patch? When Marty shows you how to cut the original block and insert strips to create a whole new block! She will have samples to share that will help you create your block. Your finished block will look much more complicated than what you started with!

March:

Friday, March 4, 2022 - "Fun With Circles" Instructor: Debi Warner

This class will review the role of circles in quilting history, show ways to sew curves, and helps each person create an art piece. Debi will explore the techniques used by Tom Russell to create these circle masterpieces and will provide several themes to consider.



December 11, 2021

Present remotely: Diana Wolf, Marge Wold, Judy Brown, Judy White, Audrey Croft, Marilyn H, Linda Damon, Alice Gibson, Audrey Horton, Jan Bathke, Rachel Skye. Present in person were 93 members and 31 guests. From the guests, we gained five new members. A quorum was established.

Kathe Letulle called the meeting to order at 9:05 am. Jean Waufle was excited to see such a wonderful turnout. She also reminded the members who brought guests to encourage their guests to join the Guild. She also thanked Gail Steinbeck, her husband and Renie Stinson, a volunteer, who all put in much effort getting their hall ready for our meeting.

Kathe reminded us the Guild members are all here for each other; we educate each other, celebrate with each other, and sometimes depend on each other through life's journey. Whether we connected over Zoom, or in person at meetings like this, we continue to survive as a Guild. She stated the Board still needs volunteers for several positions, Historian, Secretary, Newsletter, Publicity and a Quilt Show Chair for the 2023 Show.

The Secretary's report was approved as printed in the newsletter.

The Treasurer's report was approved and filed for audit. It will also appear in the newsletter.

Marty Morrison, Membership Chair, stated today we had 22 new and renewing members.

Military Service Quilts represented by Mellie Peach explained we try to give nominated veterans a quilt from the Guild in honor of their service. She asked for veterans in the audience to raise their hand and applause was heard. She, and the Guild, are always looking for volunteers. The volunteers can give time, donations of fabric, batting or cash, donate

their services to their committee or others. She announced a Military Sew Day on January 19th, at Snow to Sun. Everyone is invited, you do not have to be a member of the Guild to participate.

Jean Waufle, Program Chair, explained a Program chair finds people to present at out meetings. We can present some national speakers when the budget permits, and we also have several talented quilters within the Guild. Presentations can be done in person or on Zoom.

Jan Rondeau is the incoming Program Chair. She is leaving the Publicity Chair and needs to be replaced. It can be done on your own time, and much help is available from her and also the contacts at the media outlets. No special talent required.

Jan was filling in for Chris Cowan, Block Draw chair. Thirty-three 12-inch disappearing four patch blocks were turned in, which could be enough for a couple of quilts. Chris Cowan's name was drawn for half the blocks, and the rest were won by a member from Canada. Bonnie Hall turned in a quilt made from last month's blocks.

Laural Powell introduced herself as Facebook Chair. The Guild has a FB page for our closed group, and she approves members who request access.

She is also the Quilt Show Chair and this year we are planning an in-person show. Quilt registration is open, and the committee can arrange to register the quilts at your Bee if you request this. She showed the Opportunity Quilt, Ruby Whirlwind, and announced over \$1000.00 of tickets were now sold with more tickets to be distributed. Some contributions for the Silent Auction, Totes and More and the Boutique were brought to today's meeting. Two classes will be held at the Show, no sewing machine required to complete them. She is available for any questions.

The schoolhouse attendees last month made corded bowls, and Debbie Williams talked about this and previous classes taught by Guild members. Future classes will be a slow stitching technique (Continued next page)

from India in January, an exploding four patch in February, and a hand project, "Fun with Circles" in March.

Diana Wolf talked about teaching beginning sewing with Josie McVey to a group of new sewers in Lyford, Texas. Some don't have sewing machines but arrangements were made to loan them. Guild members have been generous with their scraps, fabric, notions and some older sewing machines for this effort, and it is appreciated by all.

Debi Warner made the group aware there will be a quilt appraiser at the Show. It's important to have a quilt appraised. In case of an unfortunate accident, the insurance value is equal to a cheap blanket cost at a big box store. Having a quilt appraised is also a thorough educational experience about your quilt and includes many relevant details about it.

The Guild also sponsors two retreats, each about 5 days long. It is held at the John Newcome Tennis Ranch near San Antonio. Food is prepared by a chef, so all you need to do is sew as much as you want. There are excellent accommodations and excellent comradery experienced. There are a few openings at the first retreat and a wait list for the second.

Kathe introduced Marsha Santow, the incoming president. The Fat Quarter draw was held.

Pat Skye announced fifteen Bees have loaned quilts to be exhibited at the Harlingen Arts and Heritage Museum from middle of January to middle of March.

Kathe Letulle presented several ideas for Bargain Barn boutique items which are quick and easy to make. The Boutique makes money for the Guild at the Quilt Show. Patterns and information to make these will be posted on the website.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:58.




