- No contract, so we can hunt for a more convenient location.



you will need a machine to finish off your project at home. Debbie is providing your board, prepped with the weaving diagram, as well as instructions for completing a table topper or decor pillow with your completed panel.

Some seats are still available...so be sure to sign up online soon if you are interested.

On **December** 3rd, Nancy Schmidt will be leading the Schoolhouse class for her Paper Pieced Table Runner. Nancy will be providing the foundation paper for the paper pieced blocks as well as all instructions needed for completing this attractive table runner. The material list



provides material needed for a 3 panel table runner, but you can easily add more blocks if you prefer a longer runner. Nancy is encouraging attendees to consider doing the runner in holiday colors...and you might even want to make several for gifts!

On **January 7th**, Paula McCutchen is going to be sharing her talents at making an amazing Cork



Wallet. She has adapted her wallet pattern to have more generous pockets for credit cards. In the material list she allows various weights of cork fabric. In response to questions, Kathe Letulle has requested we publish that the Mondo bag pattern includes instructions and fusible panels. Additional fusible panels can be purchased separately.



RGVQG General Meeting Minutes

Aug 13, 2022

There were 33 members present, so a quorum was established.

The meeting was called to order by President Marsha Santow at 9:00 am who turned the meeting over to the Program Chair, Jan Rondeau. She introduced Kathe Letulle who presented the Mondo, Midi and Mini bags with tips and tricks about how to make them. The pattern which includes fusible pattern pieces and extensive instructions is published by Quiltsmart. Kathe will teach the class to other groups and would appreciate only a donation for the cost of gasoline, the teaching is free.

Mike Hall, Treasurer, presented his reports. There were no questions so it will be filed for audit and printed in the next newsletter.

The Secretary's minutes of the last General meeting was accepted with no changes as printed in the last newsletter.

Newsletter articles are due this coming Monday, as usual.

Debbie Williams, Schoolhouse chair, presented the upcoming classes. The November, December and January programs are available for sign up on the RGVQG website now. Classes will be held in the sewing room at Pharr South RV Park from 9 am until 3 pm. The cost per class remains \$\$20.00 for members. November will be a woven panel project, approximately 18 inches square taught by Debbie Williams. She will supply the boards for the class. December will be a table runner composed of 3 blocks, two of which are paper pieced; one is a traditionally pieced block taught by Nancy Schmidt. Nancy will supply the paper piecing foundation for students. The project can be adapted to other uses. January class will be a cork wallet taught by Paula McCutchan. Many members expressed interest when it was presented previously. Cork material is available

from several sources. If you purchase a thin cork fabric, Paula will bring some material to make it sturdier. Bonnie Hall will be teaching a zippered project bag for the March Schoolhouse class. Mike Hall told the group that we are no longer able to use Trophy Gardens as a meeting place. He was able to reserve an auditorium and a couple of extra rooms at the McAllen Public Library from November through March at about half of the expense at Trophy Gardens. April is optional. He noted it will be a bit further for members in the lower Valley. There is no contract. We will be able to have Friendship Day and the Quilters Swap there. The library doors do not open until 9 am. and no persons are admitted prior to that time. We may have to adjust the time the Guild meeting commences.

If the Guild can find a more agreeable location, any monies on deposit are fully refundable up until 24 hours prior to the meeting. No mid valley RV parks were available, and no ISD seemed available for meetings. Mike encouraged members to keep looking. An important consideration is to have the ability to present the meeting via Zoom for members who do not attend in person. Retreat still has 7 openings in Friendship Star and a waiting list has been established for Blue Bonnet. A deposit is required to hold your place, but it can be refunded with sufficient notice. Call Kathe Letulle, Retreat Chair, for more details. Additionally, when A Block Away quilt shop closed, they donated several hundred items to the Guild. A list will be sent to each Guild chair and they will have a week to request items for their committee. The items will be bundled, boxed, labeled and distributed to the chairs by Kathe's volunteers. Those chairs who are not able to get their box early will have their box put into the storage until they are able to retrieve it.

Programs chair Jan Rondeau announced the programs have not yet been settled for September and October. In November, The Tanzanian Angel Project will be shown by Mary Mayfield in person. The group in Tanzania makes unique hand dyed batik fabrics, very different

than what is available in most shops. Funds raised by the project are used to support girls there to attend school and learn employable skills. Part of the kit cost supports this effort. The project we will see is a table runner made from these special batik fabrics. The program class will be held the following Monday due to Veterans' Day programs. Registration is available now and is \$45 per student. The mandatory kit which includes the special precut high-quality batiks is \$40.00. Ms. Mayfield will also be bringing some yardage and bolts of the fabric, although she is limited to what she can bring is two suitcases.

The December Friendship Day program needs a Bee or a group of four to five persons plan and do it. If it's held at the library, we have to purchase food through the library and we have funds for that expense. It's a day to have fun and get to know each other a bit better. Bring your friends. The January program will be by Randi York. She will walk us through how you take a concept, design a quilt and move through the process to completing your unique quilt and entering it for competition. February will have no speaker as we are getting ready for the Quilt Show held the following week. March will be the Quilter's Swap meeting. April's meeting will be presented by Suzi Parron who has written two books about Barn Quilts.

Kathe Letulle is helping with Sunshine and Shadows. We have sent two sympathy cards this last month. We relayed a conversation with Mellie Peach who sounds like she is doing very well on her recovery. Mellie wanted to thank everyone for the card and thoughts.

Chris Cowan announced the newsletter deadline is the following Monday. She will put in a block pattern in the newsletter this coming issue. Marty Morrison reported the nominating committee has succeeded in finding candidates for open officer positions to be elected in November. Additionally, we need Historian, a Hostess, and Publicity chairs.

Our insurance provider will no longer be underwriting institutional organizations like us and

our insurance broker is searching for another company to provide this service, announced Mike Hall. He is confident we will be able to find a company to cover our liability needs before our coverage expires in October.

Door prizes were won by Josie McVey, Linda Osborn and Garnett Weaver.

The meeting was adjourned by Marsha Santow.
