- An opportunity for all Bees to do a 15 minute demo both Friday and Saturday at the Quilt Show. This is an opportunity for those attending the quilt show to learn more about your Bee and also to make new friends within the Rio Grande Valley.
- Each Bee will have a table to display their Bee Banner, any information about their Bee and If the Bee desires can SELL KITS (made for the item they demoed) for quilt show attendees to take home.
- YOUR BEE sets the amount they want to sell their kits and KEEPS THE MONEY for their Bee. You can sell your kits at your table all day if you want, or just the hour you're scheduled to demo. THE CHOICE is yours! If you want you can leave your kits and put up an Honor system jar for the collected money that is ok. BUT the RGV Guild is NOT responsible for the money.
- Whatever your Bee decides they are responsible for collecting the money and manning their booth.
 And it is ok to just do a demo and not sell kits.
 This is the Bee's choice.
- Since this is a 15 minute demo and Bees keep the money for selling kits, you will be expected to pay to get into the guilt show.
- DEADLINE for Bees to register to participate is December 1 Demo times for each Bee will be announced by the 2nd week of December so there is plenty of time for scheduling.

She asked for nominations from the floor for each position needed. There were none. We only had one volunteer for each office. Island. It is open to all guild members. She will put the information in the newsletter.


Next was Show and Tell....
