- The retreats are so much fun and the friendships formed are awesome. Everyone is willing to assist in any quilting, sewing, pattern questions, etc - everyone has a suggestion, just use the one that works best for you.
- 2. The retreats are held at John Newcomb Tennis Ranch in New Braunfels, Texas -
- 3. The fee is \$300 with a \$100 deposit sleeping arrangements are 4 to a condo. The condo is divided into two bedrooms, each with their own bathroom. There is also a kitchen, living room and washer and dryer
- 4. The meals begin at dinner on day of arrival, next three days -3 meals and 2 snacks, and final day breakfast. The meals are to die for as well as the desserts.
- 5. The large conference room is where we sew and have area quilt shops present their wares for the attendees to urchase. There are also quite a few quilt shops in the area for shopping opportunity

A packet containing maps and detailed information will be available at a later date, on the Guild's web site, rgvqg.com (members only).


Queen City Buzzzzzz

### Scrap Block Draw

We're back to drawing a winner of the blocks, so join in and have fun!

For February, 16 blocks of **Old Maid's Puzzle**, October 20<sup>th</sup> in the Block a Day calendar, were submitted by by Nancy Malmin, Pat Skye and me.



March's block is the "Yankee Puzzle" an open domain pattern. We are going to give you choices, 8" or 12" finished size. We'll draw two names, one for each size.

Each block requires 16 HSTs, either 3-1/2" or 2-1/2" unfinished size. That's 8 of main color and light

background, 4 of main color and contrast, and 4 of contrast and background. Note when your MC/C and C/BG HSTs are assembled to look like flying geese that the MC should be the left wing. If not you'll get a counterclockwise spin like my purple oopsie!!

## RGVQG General Meeting FEBRUARY 4, 2023

#### QUILT SHOW:

Marsha called on Laural Powell to share information for the quilt show. She wants us to give ourselves a big hand for the number of entries we have entered. It is over 350 and is more than we have ever had.

There will be a change in voting this year. The voting will be done on Friday and ribbons will be up on Saturday.

We are having a block party. The fabrics will be beach colored. 10 vendors will be participating and there will be a list in the brochure that will be handed out at the door.

Dale Shafer with the Wool Gathers will have an exhibit. She has 3 spinners coming to demonstrate. There will be info on weaving, rug hooking and embroidery.

Laural explained that the Bees will be doing scheduled demos throughout the show. The schedule for these will be in the show brochure. Laurie McGee-Appraisal chairperson-she stresses that if you have won a ribbon it is a good idea to get your quilt appraised for insurance reasons. She also explained some of the ways you can get a final appraisal.

Laural said the Bees will be doing a bag check so we can check our heavier bags so we can continue shopping.

Joy Paugh said she has 100 volunteers this year. She explained what she will have ready for you in the volunteer area.

Laural stated we have 23 vendors this year. Also, we will be giving a ribbon away this year in honor

of Debbie Warner. It will be for the "funnest" quilt this year.

Mike Hall explained the scissors and knife sharpener booth.

Leslie Lorenzo explained what she would like done when a large group is coming in to the show please call her.

Nancy Boyer-boutique-she is busy sorting all the donations for the boutique. She wants us to know that some great items have been donated this year.
