

#### Silent Auction



#### 2024 RGVQG Quilt Show Chairs Choice

The Chairs Choice will require the use of the kite



shape, created either with a template or 4 triangles and/or a kite theme. This shape can be part of the background or neutral space or

it can be very graphic as the example above. It can be appliqued, pieced or a combination of both. This shape can be part of the quilting pattern.



- No kits
- No size limitations.
- If you use a published pattern, the designer must be listed in your registration.
- The quilt must represent the theme "Take Flight" in some manner.
- Use your imagination!

# 2024 RGVQG Quilt Show Challenge "Take Flight"

Jean and I challenge you to create something beautiful using wool, and addressing the theme, "Take Flight"

- The item is limited to a maximum perimeter of 72", and if the item is a circle, its diameter can be no bigger than 18".
- Must have wool elements, decorative stitching and embellishments but can include other materials.
- The entry can include mug rugs, jewelry, bell pulls, pillows, buttons, pin cushions, pictures, rugs etc. It can also be punch-needle, or any other item made of wool with decorative stitching and/or embellishment.
- A wool kit will be acceptable with the requirement that the maker add personal elements to the kit and indicate the designer and additions on their entry form.
- A list of shops both online and store fronts will be posted on the guild website. The Woolies group is willing to be a resource as well.


# Scrap Block Draw

We're back to drawing a winner of the blocks, so join in and have fun!

March's block was the "Yankee Puzzle" an open domain pattern. We gave 2 choices, 8" or 12" finished size. 11- 12" and 12- 8" blocks were turned in by Nancy Malmin and me. Nancy won both sets.

April's block is a fun 2-fer made from a set of charm squares, Windmill and a Star variation.



With coordinating 2 medium/dark A, 4 medium/dark B and 5 light background C 5" charm squares, you get one block of each type.

Using 2 A and 2 C squares make 4 HST's by drawing diagonal line on C squares, layer on A squares and sew a scant  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on both sides of line. Do not trim after cutting on the diagonal. Draw another diagonal line on the HST's perpendicular to the seam. Layer on the 4 B squares and again sew a scant  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on either side of the line. Cut on the diagonal. If scant seams used, HST combination units should just be 4-1/2". If smaller trim all to 4-1/4".

You will have 4 "right" and 4 "left" units, see diagram on photo. Use the "right" units to make the Pinwheel.

For the Star block, cut 2 of the C squares into 4 2-1/2"  $\times$  4-1/2" rectangles. (2-3/8"  $\times$  4-1/4" if trimmed HST's are 4-1/4"). Cut 2-1/2" (2-3/8") square from remaining C square. Stitch rectangles to right side of the "left" units and then use partial seaming to construct Star block.
