That was our program today and many members learned several things to consider doing as they make their quilts. Even if you don't want a quilt evaluated or judged, most of us want to present well-made quilts to others.

Some of our best programs have come from member suggestions from several years ago. The Program chair is responsible for finding and arranging contracts with speakers. Many of our speakers do their presentations over Zoom as that cuts Guild expenses. She also persuades members to do our summer programs. We have sample contracts you can use.

The Show Board has storage in Laguna Vista for the items that are destined for Totes and More, as well as the Boutique. Contact Laurie Magee or




Jean Waufle and we will get these items into storage.

2024 RGVQG Quilt Show Chairs Choice

The Chairs Choice will require the use of the kite shape, created either with a template or 4 triangles and/or a kite theme. This shape can be part of the background or neutral space or it can be very graphic as the example to the right. It can be appliqued, pieced or a combination of both. This shape can be part of the quilting pattern.



- No kits
- No size limitations.
- If you use a published pattern, the designer must be listed in your registration.
- The quilt must represent the theme "Take Flight" in some manner.
- Use your imagination!

2024 RGVQG Quilt Show Challenge "Take Flight"

Jean and Laurie challenge you to create something beautiful with at least one wool element, and addressing the theme, "Take Flight"

- The item is limited to a maximum perimeter of 72", and if the item is a circle, its diameter can be no bigger than 18".
- Must have a wool element, decorative stitching and embellishments but can include other materials.

- The entry can include mug rugs, jewelry, bell pulls, pillows, buttons, pin cushions, pictures, rugs etc. It can also be punchneedle, or any other item made of wool with decorative stitching and/or embellishment.
- A wool kit will be acceptable with the requirement that the maker add personal elements to the kit and indicate the designer and additions on their entry form.

Summer has come and gone, and the Queen City Bees have been swarming around the Haswell Hall the whole month of June! Many of the Bees have been working on their own personal project, but they all worked together to complete the Military Quilt for a Korean War veteran for one of our



Bee's father. These worker bees cut. sewed, guilted,

basted the guilt in about four weeks. Once this project was completed, some of the bees flew to Mr. Hernandez's current residence, a nursing home in Mission to present the quilt there at the families' request. Military quilt presentation was held July 5, 2023. Mr. Hernandez was a POW during the Korean War, and his story is featured in two different documentary books. It was our honor to assist in making the guilt for him as he is one of our community Heroes. This is just a small token of appreciation for his loyalty, dedication, and service to our country, the United States of America.

Our Bee has grown, gaining 7 members and one Baby Bee since January. We welcome these new members with open wings! We continue to plan the annual fieldtrip. The destination is San Antonio's quilt show to be held September 2023. Due to Bees request, we have added another meeting to our schedule by having a Sew Day the first Sunday of the Month, allowing the Bees to work on their own projects. Many of our Bees are beginners and have been working on the 16 Mile quilt and experimenting with different straight-line blocks, therefore; Bees are wanting to challenge themselves by working on a row guilt. The Bees

have also been getting lessons from experienced Guild members such as maintaining their sewing machines, especially if they own a Featherweight. Other experienced quilters have come over to teach the Bees "how to" paper piece using scrap material donated by Guild Members. We want to "Thank all Guild Members who have donated to our Bee!! The Bees are already planning for Christmas by making and exchanging 20 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch block of their own choice and making with the inclusion of their name on each block.
